End-Of-Month Saturday Workshop

The regular Last Saturday of the Month workshops are a relaxed place to work on our trees, discuss our bonsai activities with like-minded people, or seek advice or assistance with our trees. There is usually something interesting going on, and plenty of trees to look at, in various stages of development.

If you are looking for advice or assistance, try to seek opinions from various members, and take the advice which best fits your feelings. Remember that there are no "right" answers when it comes to styling—it is your tree and your choice.

The workshops often provide a first point of contact for interested parties who are considering learning more about bonsai or joining the club.

Visitors are always welcome! Bring along any trees that you may have for advice if needed, or just come along for an introduction to the art of bonsai. There is no obligation or cost.

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Tree Profile: Ash - Fraxinus

General: According to *Wikipedia* the Ash, is a genus of flowering plants in the olive and lilac family, Oleaceae. It contains 45–65 species of usually medium to large trees, mostly deciduous though a few subtropical species are evergreen. The genus is widespread across much of Europe, Asia and North America.

It is highly regarded by 'Bonsai Enthusiasts' around the world for its bark variations and some flowering species.

Lighting & Temperature: They're very hardy and tolerate full sun to shade and can tolerate a windy spot if watered well. Frost tolerant to -10°C!

Watering: Frequently, especially during hot and windy weather, reduce watering in winter.

Feeding: Feed every two weeks during the growing season using a high nitrogen fertiliser for young trees in training! For older trees use a low nitrogen fertiliser to prevent the leaves from getting too big. Feeding less until the end of autumn will assist in reducing the leave size too. Stop feeding when leaves drop.

Repotting: Best time in spring, before bud burst, every 1 - 2 years for young plants and every 4-5 years for older ones in free draining soil. <u>Carry out root pruning up to two</u> thirds at the same time!

Pruning: Structural branch pruning and shoot pinching is best done throughout the growing season and hard pruning in winter.

Leaf pruning every second year in late spring is important to reduce the size of the large leaves. Total defoliation can be done twice per season to increase ramification

Wiring: Anytime on younger branches, but on older branches using guide wires is recommended - <u>they can be very brittle</u>!

Propagation: Use hardwood cuttings in winter and cold-treated seeds in spring. Airlayer in late-Spring after spring growth has hardened.

Pests and diseases: Watch out for scale, root rot and sooty mold.

Styles: Formal & Informal Upright, Slanting, Semi Cascade, Single or Multiple Trunks, Group Planting and Root-over-Rock.

Not good for Shohin due to leaf size!

Some species suitable for bonsai:

Fraxinus excelsior, known as the European ash or common ash, to distinguish it from other types of ash, is flowering.

The bark on young trees is pale grey and smooth, becoming rough and vertically fissured on old trees. The buds are jet black.

Fraxinus *angustifolia*, the **narrow-leafed ash**, the bark is smooth and pale grey on young trees, becoming square-cracked and knobbly on old trees. The buds are pale brown, which readily distinguishes it from the Fraxinus excelsior.

Fraxinus ornus, the **South European flowering ash**, the bark is dark grey, <u>remaining smooth even on old trees</u>. The buds are pale pinkish-brown to grey-brown. The flowers are produced in dense panicles 10cm long after the new leaves appear in late spring.

Bonsai Calendar: May—June

As Autumn draws to a close, your deciduous trees have completed their growth cycle and are in preparation for dormancy. Evergreen varieties may not stop growing completely but their growth rate will slow down dramatically. Among many other tasks, winter is a great time to contemplate styling and restyling your bonsai (especially deciduous trees). Having the ability to see the skeleton of your trees will assist you in improving the basic branch structure and ramification of your bonsai.

Here are a few things to consider over the winter months.

- Remove all fruit and seeds from your trees as it can promote die back and disease.
- Once all the green leaves have changed or fallen you can begin cutting back on deciduous trees to shape with out fear of the tree bleeding.
- After all leaves have fallen, clean up all debris around your bonsai area (including the tops of the pots), to reduce potential homes and hiding places for pests.
- Any trees that have been protected from the summer sun can be pushed back into the open. The winter sun will promote bud development and tighten spring growth.
- Adjust your watering routine as your trees will be using less water. Rain may be more common. Avoid over watering at this time of year as trees are extremely susceptible to root rot. Keep deciduous trees on the dry side to promote autumn colour.
- If possible, make a habit of watering at the warmest part of the day. This will give the excess water a chance to drain before the cold nights.
- Keep an eye on pots that get completely covered with moss. This may interrupt the water intake and increase the chance of root rot.
- May and June are the best times to do heavy pruning and shaping to most conifers.
- Wire and bend branches while trees are on the dry side of the watering cycle. This will improve the flexibility of the branches and so reduce cracking or breaking.

Fertilizing isn't required for any dormant trees, but evergreens can still benefit from a light feeding.
